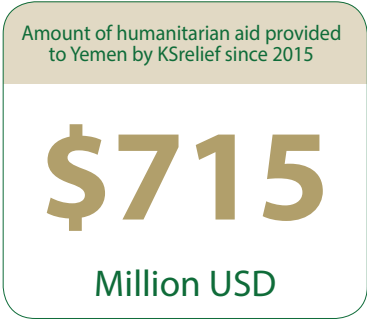
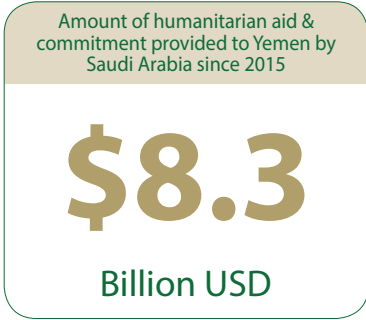




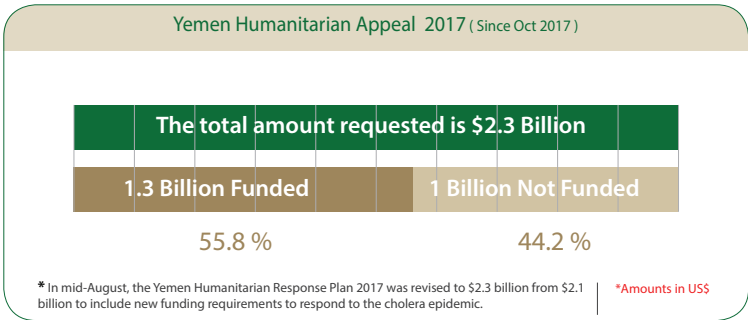

in Riyadh, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.



- Progress**
- Under the patronage of the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques, the Supervisor General of King Salman Humanitarian Aid & Relief Centre announced that the Riyadh International Humanitarian Forum will be held on 24-26 February 2018, and invited all to participate in this important event.
  - On Sunday, 29 October 2017, the King Salman Humanitarian Aid and Relief Centre (KSrelief) held a High-Level Meeting to Enhance Humanitarian Response in Yemen; the summit took place in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. The event was attended by representatives of other organizations and distinguished guests, with the participation of: H.E. Dr. Abdullah Al Rabeeah, Advisor – Royal Court and Supervisor General of KSrelief, H.E. Dr. Abdulmalik al-Mekhlafi, Yemen's Deputy Premier and Minister of Foreign Affairs, H.E. Sir Mark Lowcock, United Nations Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator and the Head of the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA), and Major Abdullah Alhbabi, Chief of Military Civilian Operations, representatives of humanitarian organizations, and other distinguished guests.
  - The number of cholera cases reported by MSF treatment centers has significantly decreased since the peak of the outbreak. On 19 October 2017, the World Health Organization (WHO) said data indicated the number of suspected cases of cholera is declining;

**Recommendations:**



-  To **assign** needs and response team to support the process of needs and response by verifying actual needs through comparison of needs reports on the Yemeni crisis.
-  To **assign** a technical and financial support team to provide whatever is necessary to support humanitarian organizations and humanitarian projects in Yemen.
-  To **adopt** five geographical areas in response to the humanitarian needs of Yemen (Aden, Hadhramout, Ma'rib, Al Hudaydah and San'a'a) to help redistribute humanitarian assistance fairly to all Yemenis.
-  To **support** the initiative of the Special Envoy to the Secretary-General for Yemen regarding Al Hudaydah Port and San'a'a Airport, with emphasis on using the rest of the Yemeni ports, the Saudi port of Jizan and land ports-of-entry to facilitate access to humanitarian assistance.
-  To **focus** on the significance of increased presence by international humanitarian organizations in all regions of Yemen, with no exceptions.

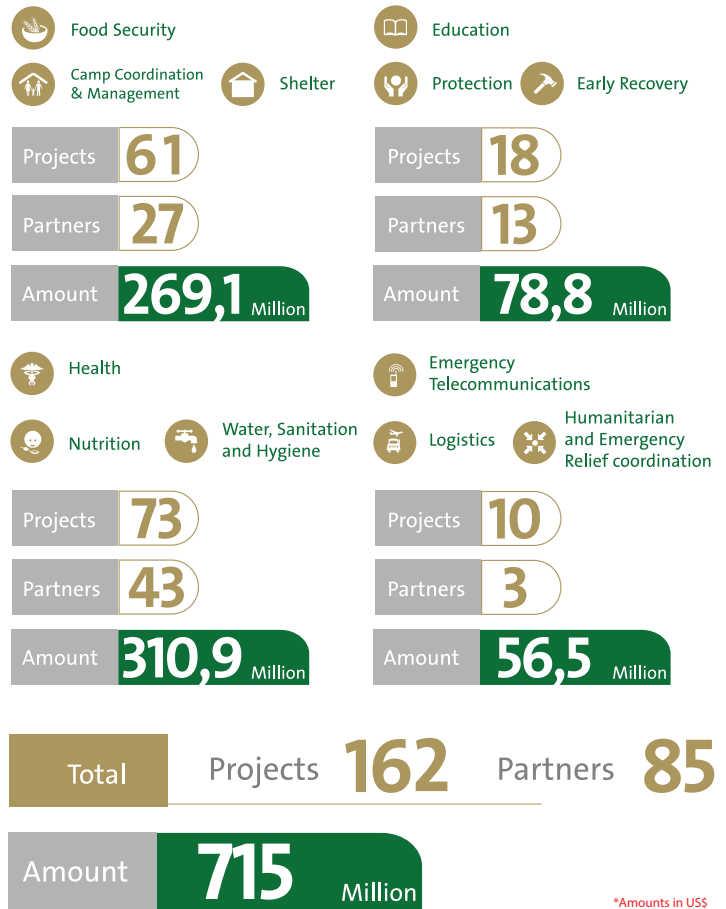


### Progress

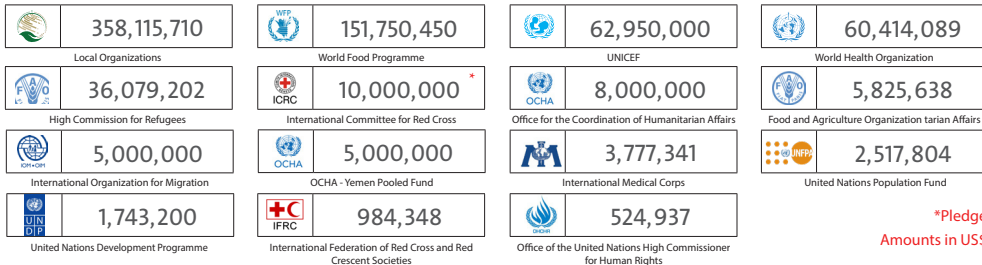
there was a decrease from 51,000 cases per week to 35,000 cases in the first two weeks of October.

- KSrelief provided treatment, health care, and medicines totaling USD \$800,000 to treat Yemenis who have suffered serious injuries in Aden and Taiz; this aid is being administered through Yemen's Ministry of Public Health and population, Al Safwa Hospital, and Al Buraihiy Hospital.
- Through the Al-Badiyh Charitable Foundation, KSrelief distributed 16,000 food baskets with a total value of USD \$966,666 to assist 96,000 beneficiaries in Lahij and Taiz.
- Medical students at Hadhramout University participated in KSrelief's Dengue Fever Control Project by contributing in several areas, including a health education campaign and field inspections to control insect vectors in Mukalla neighborhoods which took place over six consecutive days. The project targeted about 3,600 homes in affected neighborhoods in the western areas of Mukalla. These interventions are part of a larger program covering 44 districts in six Yemeni governorates.
- KSrelief is funding the establishment of an Orthopedic and Surgery Center at Al-Thawra General Hospital in Taiz, at a total cost of USD \$2,000,000.

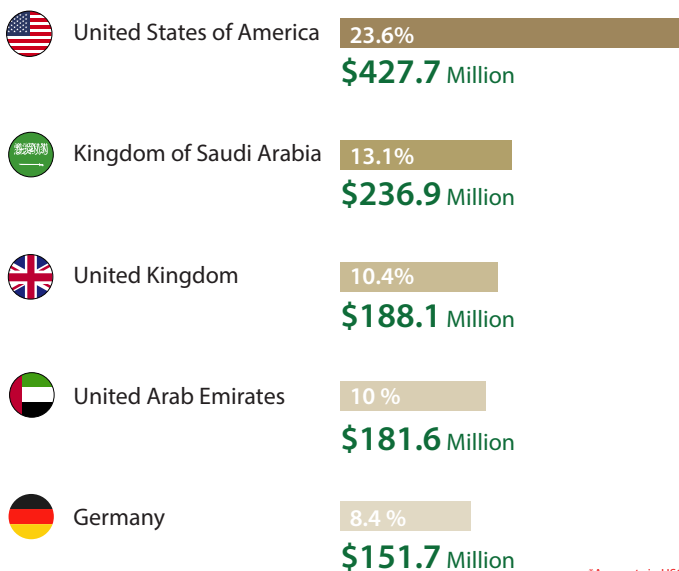
### KSrelief Projects in Yemen Since 2015 (Since 30 Oct 2017)



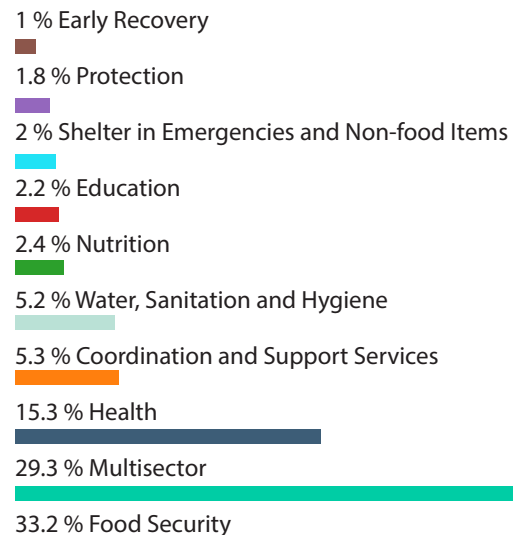
### KSrelief's Contributions Through the UN Organizations and International Organizations in Yemen Since 2015
